




# Overview





- Medical methods
  - excluded from patent protection<sup>1</sup>



- Products\* for use in medical methods
  - → not excluded<sup>2</sup>
- Methods of manufacturing such products
  - → also not excluded



#### **BUT:**

Medical product also excluded from patent protection, if medical method step, in particular, surgical step is inevitably included in providing the medical product<sup>1</sup>.



### Case law example: Cerebral implant (T 1731/12)

Claim 1: **Device** with two electrodes and a controller configured such that the <u>stimuli of the electrodes reset the phase of the neuronal activity</u> of at least two sub-populations of a neuron population such that the two sub-populations have a different phase after the stimuli.

According to the description:

- 5. Kalibrierung und Regelung:
- 5.1. Alle Elektroden 2 liegen in der zu desynchronisierenden Neuronenpopulation:

Preparatory measurements and calibrations using already implanted electrodes necessary.

- → Surgical step implicitly and inevitably included
- → Exclusion from patent protection
